• **2023 AGM:** held on May 15th with 120 members and guests in attendance. Guest speaker Simon Paradis, Shell's Canada Energy Transition Program Manager spoke about Shell's Energy Transition Plan. - Volunteer events: There have been several events in 2023 including...
 - 33 volunteers sorted donations at the Calgary Drop-In Donations Centre on March 27th.
 - 6 volunteers did yard and garden maintenance at The Alcove Addiction Recover for Women Centre in the Altadore community on May 25^{th.}
 - Three times doing yard and garden maintenance at the Alex Community Food Centre with 9 volunteers on July 31st, 11 volunteers on August 28th, and 3 volunteers October 25th. We decided to try a regular monthly or so event at the Alex to help them keep up the maintenance of their yard and garden and we may do this again in 2024, stay tuned. Many thanks go to Sarah Russell Crow for agreeing to organize the regular events at the Alex CFC.
 - There was also an appeal put out to our members via the Facebook group in July to help with the community cleanup after an EF4 tornado hit Didsbury and Carstairs on Canada Day. Three members helped in the recovery and clean-up and their efforts were very much appreciated by families affected by the tornado.

• Shell OilTimers Outdoor Club (SOOC)

- Summer (Ric Young, Peter Snell): 2023 marked the 10th anniversary of Tuesday summer hikes for Shell Oiltimers. Under the moniker 'Shell Oiltimers and Friends', we scheduled 'more' and 'less' strenuous hikes on 20 Tuesdays this past summer. A total of 107 folks participated in at least one hike and an average of 30 hikers per hike. Trail gate parties were organized on three occasions and were highly successful, as was the wind-up lunch in September at the Powderhorn Saloon in Bragg Creek. Smoke and inclement weather interfered on three occasions but otherwise, the more strenuous hikes were very well attended.

 - The work of over a dozen volunteers helps make these hikes happen, as does the financial support from the Shell Oiltimers Club for use of the Evite system. Shoulder hikes are planned from week to week when Oiltimer winter activities aren't happening on Tuesdays, and we're organizing ourselves to have an exciting schedule of Tuesday hikes for the summer of 2024 and for the decade to come.
- Winter (Nancy Renaux, Peter Snell): The snow conditions are starting to look good! We will hold weekly cross-country ski trips to the groomed trails in Bragg Creek, Kananaskis, or Banff/Lake Louise and weekly snowshoe/winter hikes, both on Tuesdays. We often have MS (More Strenuous) and LS (Less Strenuous) groups going out. For the XC skiing, we are "Classic" skiers – not "Skate" skiers.

Payment for events/offers can be via Interac e-Transfer, cheque or if paying by credit card, a surcharge of 1.5% is added to the total cost.
